Due to COVID-19) 2019-1¹

Due to the exigent circumstances created by the COVID-19 pandemic, and pursuant to the Criminal Justice Act, 18 U.S.C. § 3006A(a)(1) and (c), and the discretion of the court, Standing Order 2019-1 is hereby **SUPPLEMENTED** to include that the Federal Public Defender for the Western District of Virginia is appointed to represent any defendant sentenced in this district who was previously determined to have been entitled to appointment of counsel, or who is now indigent, to determine whether the defendant may qualify for compassionate release as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3582(c), as revised by section 603 of the First Step Act of 2018.

The Probation Office and the Clerk of the United States District Court for the Western District of Virginia are authorized to disclose Presentence Investigation Reports, Statement of Reasons and Judgments to the Federal Public Defender for the purpose of determining eligibility for compassionate relief under the First Step Act of 2018.
