IN RE: APPOINTMENT OF CJA PANEL SELECTION COMMITTEE

ORDER

IT APPEARING to the Court that the Plan for the Composition, Administration, and Management of the Panel of Private Attorneys under the Criminal Justice Act for the United States District Court for the Western District of Virginia, as approved on April 24, 2007, provides for the establishment of a Panel Selection Advisory Committee, whose duties are as set forth in the Plan;

AND IT APPEARING that the Internal Operational Guidelines for the Criminal Justice Act Advisory Committee provide that the Chief Judge of the Court has the duty and authority to appoint one Criminal Justice Act Panel member from each of the divisions of the Court to serve together with the Clerk of the Court and the Federal Public Defender for the District;

AND IT FURTHER APPEARING that there are presently vacancies in both the Lynchburg and Roanoke divisions on the Panel Selection Advisory Committee and in the position of Chairperson of the Committee. It is therefore

ORDERED

that the following Criminal Justice Act Panel attorneys are hereby appointed as the Criminal Justice Panel Selection Advisory Committee representatives in the Lynchburg and Roanoke divisions, as indicated, to fill the unexpired terms in those divisions, and each will be eligible for appointment to a full term.

P. Scott Debruin – Lynchburg division
James C. Turk, Jr – Roanoke division

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that James C. Turk, Jr. shall serve a Chairperson of the Criminal Justice Panel Selection Advisory Committee.

The Clerk shall send a copy of this Order to each District Judge and Magistrate Judge of this Court; to each member of the Criminal Justice Act Panel of this Court, to the Federal Public Defender for this District; to the United States Attorney for this District; to the Circuit Executive; and to the Defender Services Division of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts.
