**RESTRICTIONS ON VISITORS** TO POFF FEDERAL BUILDING

Standing Order No. 2020-6

The United States District Court for the Western District of Virginia, in consultation with the Poff Federal Building Facilities Security Committee, adopts Standing Order 2020-6 as an addendum to Standing Order 2020-4, concerning Restrictions on Visitors to Courthouses.

This Standing Order specifically addresses the public health crisis associated with COVID-19 in the unique circumstance of the multi-tenant Poff Federal Building in Roanoke.

Effective March 19, 2020, it is **ORDERED** that public access to the Poff Federal Building is restricted as follows:

- 1. Only members of the public having business with the United States District Court are permitted to enter the Poff Federal Building.
- 2. Persons seeking to file documents with the District Court Clerk's Office are directed to advise the Court Security Officers of their intention. Court Security Officers are to security screen any proposed filings and direct the filer to remain in the building fover, where they will be met by Clerk's Office staff. Upon notification by the Court Security Officer, Clerk's Office staff are directed to come to the building lobby, receive any filings and provide appropriate receipts. Any other requests of the Clerk's Office may be addressed by Clerk's Office staff in the building fover. Should that limited access be insufficient, the Clerk, or her designee, or any judge of the court may permit additional access as necessary and appropriate. For all other inquiries, please contact the Clerk's Office at (540) 857-5100.
- 3. Persons seeking access to the United States Probation Office are directed to advise the

Court Security Officer of their intention. Upon notification, Probation staff will address

any requests in the building fover or adjacent conference rooms. Should that limited

access be insufficient, the Chief Probation Officer, or her designee, or any judge of the

court may permit additional access as necessary and appropriate. For all other inquiries,

please contact the Probation Office at (540) 857-5180.

4. Employees and staff performing essential government functions may continue to access

the Poff Federal Building.

5. Members of the bar, clients, witnesses, and law enforcement officers are permitted to

attend any initial criminal proceeding or other hearing exempted from Standing Order

2020-5 concerning Court Operations Under the Exigent Circumstances Created by

COVID-19.

6. This Order is intended to supplement, and not supersede, Standing Order 2020-4 as

regards the Poff Federal Building. The restrictions on access contained in Standing Order

2020-4 remain in place.

7. The United States Marshal, his Deputies, and the Court Security Officers shall deny entry

to anyone attempting to enter the Poff Federal Building in violation of this Standing

Order and Standing Order 2020-4.

8. These temporary restrictions will remain in place until it is determined to be safe to

remove them.

9. This Order shall be updated as further public health guidance is received.
