STANDING ORDER

This day came the United States, by counsel, and moved the Court for an Order providing that in each and every petty offense case initiated by a violation notice, the Court issue an arrest

warrant in lieu of a summons should the defendant fail to respond to the notice to appear issued

by the Clerk of Court.

And it appearing to be proper, it is hereby

ORDERED

that in all petty offense cases initiated by violation notice, the Court shall, in its discretion, issue

an arrest warrant in lieu of a summons should the defendant fail to respond to the notice to appear issued by the Clerk of Court, conditioned on the violation notice including an appropriate statement of probable cause, made in writing upon oath or penalty of perjury, pursuant to Rule 4(c) of the Rules of Procedure for the Trial of Misdemeanors Before United States Magistrates.
