STANDING ORDER NO. 2018-7

Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3563(b)(22), 18 U.S.C. § 3583(d), and Rules 32(d) and (e) of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure, it is hereby **ORDERED** that, in making a sentencing recommendation to the court for a defendant who:

- 1) is convicted of a sex offense as defined under the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA); or
- 2) is otherwise required to register with any local, state, or federal sex offender registry; or
- 3) has a history that may otherwise justify the need for additional conditions; the probation officer shall consider and recommend to the court in a presentence report appropriate special conditions of probation or supervised release that are reasonably related to the factors referred to in 18 U.S.C. § 3583(d)(1); involve no greater deprivation of liberty than is reasonably necessary; and are consistent with any pertinent policy statements issued by the Sentencing Commission. See United States v. Armel, 585 F.3d 182, 186 (4th Cir. 2009).

To that end, the Probation Office is **DIRECTED** to prepare, and publish on the court's external website, a Sex Offender Conditions Worksheet to be used by probation officers in making their written recommendations to the court in the presentence report.

It is further **ORDERED** that, in the criminal cases encompassed by this Standing Order, the probation officer shall disclose the recommended special conditions in the presentence report prior to sentencing.

It is hereby **ORDERED** that Standing Order 2013–14, entered on June 25, 2013, shall be, and it hereby is, vacated and superseded by this Standing Order.

The Clerk is directed to enter this Standing Order in the book order for each division of this court and to mail certified copies to the Judges and Magistrate Judges, the United States

Attorney, the Federal Public Defender, and the Chief Probation Officer for this district.
